

STONELEIGH-BURNHAM EQUESTRIAN CENTER INFORMATION FOR BOARDING OR LEASING A HORSE

The Stoneleigh-Burnham Riding Facilities are open to all students. The School provides for the board of privately owned horses and the School owns a number of quality horses that can be leased out to individual students as well.

GENERAL NOTES:

1. Students are expected to have appropriate riding clothes including hard-soled shoes or boots, and an ASTM/SEI approved riding hat.
2. It is strongly suggested that ALL EQUIPMENT BE MARKED with the student's name or horse's name.
3. Students should note that anyone boarding or leasing a horse will be required to donate one hour per week of her time to the barn.
4. All boarding, leasing, lessons, and show fees including transportation and travel expenses will be billed to the student's account.
5. Storage areas are available for students' equipment, such as trunks, blankets, tack, etc.

LEASING HORSES

The fee for leasing a horse is \$2,500 per trimester. This lease fee is associated with horses that do not leave the property, but have the option to show at our home shows. The fee for leasing a show horse is \$5,000 per trimester. Show horses are the horses that will be competing with Lease at various shows throughout the East Coast. The lease fee will be billed at the beginning of each trimester. Stoneleigh- Burnham will cover all necessary veterinary fees and farrier fees for all leased horses, unless the student is negligent. Students leasing a horse are requested to furnish their own tack and equipment. This includes a saddle, girth, bridle, saddles pads and any necessary polos or jumping boots. Students needing any equipment can rent it from the school for an all-inclusive fee of \$150.00 per trimester. Arrangements for renting equipment can be made through Director of Riding, Mina Payne. Please note, in order to offset the year-round expenses of a leased horse, we may use these horses in SBS IEA / IHSA shows & the community lesson program if the lessee will be away that day.

BOARDING HORSES

ARRIVAL: Horses should arrive at SBS between the hours of 9:00 am and 4:00 pm, Monday through Saturday. Please notify the Stable Office of your intended arrival time (413-773-8333). This should be done at least 48 hours in advance. A current vaccination record and a negative Coggins test within one year must be received prior to arrival. Stoneleigh-Burnham is not insured for privately owned horses. If your horse is insured for more than \$10,000, please have your insurance agency send a certificate naming Stoneleigh-Burnham School as additionally insured.

CHARGES: The fee to board is \$750. per month. All horse-boarding expenses will be charged on a monthly statement. There is a stall deposit fee of \$500 required to cover any damages to the stalls, above normal wear and tear. The deposit is credited at the end of the year if no damage is noted. Stalls are rented by the month. The only times the School will charge for part of one month is September and June. Please take this into account when planning any short-term departures. Board includes our feed, hay, bedding, stall cleaning, and daily turnout pending weather conditions.

Any additional services are extra. Exercise lunging can be arranged at \$30 per session. Free lunging \$15 per session. Training of horses can also be arranged at \$80 per session.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS: For the safety of the boarders, during hours where Stoneleigh-Burnham Equestrian Center staff are not on premises, SBS requires another adult to be with the rider while using our facilities.

FEED: We feed Poulin ProMax Pellets containing 12% protein and 12% fat. If you choose to use another feed for your horse you will be charged for the purchase of the feed. We will feed supplements as provided. All supplements must be in individual daily containers for ease of feeding and accuracy. Smartpaks are encouraged or labeled baggies are acceptable.

MEDICAL:

All horses are required to have proof of current Spring vaccinations and a negative Coggins Test done within the year. Further medical requirements performed during the school year are as follows:

Fall: Teeth Floating
Equine Influenza

Spring: West Nile
Equine Influenza
Tetanus
Rabies
Eastern & Western Encephalitis
Coggins Test

All horses will be dewormed upon arrival to SBS (no exceptions). We follow a strict testing and deworming protocol as designed by our veterinarian. Following this protocol ensures we maintain the health of all horses. As routine parasite checks, all horses will have a fecal test in the fall, and again in the spring. Students will be billed according to necessary deworming charges associated with these test results.

These practices are followed to ensure that all horses are protected and inoculated against common equine ailments.

FARRIER & VETERINARIAN: Both the farrier and the veterinarian come to SBS on a regular basis and are always on call. A payment plan will need to be made with the farrier and veterinary services and will be charged directly to the student/parent at time of service. If a student/owner prefers to use a provider other than the ones the School uses, arrangements must be made in advance through the Stable Manager or Assistant Stable Manager. This includes any therapy treatments as well
